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Archery, Canoeing, Kayaking, Swimming at camp

All activities would begin with an introduction that includes safety procedures and training specific to that activity. This is required before participating. All participants must follow the instructor's directions.

About 12 participants could have a "try it" type experience in one hour. Please schedule a second session for more participants or a more in-depth experience. Both of these activities are intended to be a simple introduction and low-skill level activity focused on trying it and having fun.

These activities are highly dependent on the weather and will be canceled if it is too cold, storming, or otherwise not appropriate. Registration fees will be refunded if the activity is canceled by Templed Hills and not able to be rescheduled. The instructor will have the final say to cancel the activity.

Archery will be led by a USA Archery instructor provided by Templed Hills. Participants will be required to wear arm guards. We have several bows suited for young children. Some experienced adults and larger youth and adults may find our bows lighter and smaller than they prefer. All are welcome to try.

Canoeing and Kayaking will be led by a Templed Hills staff member with American Red Cross current certification in Lifeguarding with waterfront module and over 35 years of experience instructing canoeing and expired certification as a canoe instructor from American Canoe Association and American Red Cross. All participants must wear appropriate USCG approved lifejacket. All ages are welcome; however, lifejackets are limited for people under 50 lbs and somewhat limited 50-90lbs. Participants are welcome to bring their own type 2 or 3 USCG approved lifejacket for children. The instructor will determine if it is appropriate for use. We hope to build our supply of life jackets.

Children must be supervised by adults provided by the group, in addition to the instructor, at the regularly recommended ratio for camp.

Swimming will be available at the pool in June and July and possibly August. Templed Hills will provide lifeguards. Groups must provide adult supervision of any minor children. Groups must also provide adults to assist the lifeguard in case of emergency. Contact us for more information.



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Memorial Lodge has two stories that can be rented separately. The primary difference is that the upstairs is equipped with a small “galley style” kitchen that groups can choose to prepare their own food. The lower level does not have this, and groups are encouraged to choose the camp food service. Both floors have a spacious gathering area with comfortable seating around a fireplace as well as small tables and chairs. The top floor has 4 rooms with 5 bunk beds each. On the lower level 2 rooms have 5 bunk beds and 2 have 4 bunk beds. Each room has an individual restroom with a toilet and shower with the sink in the main bunk room. The entire building has heat and air conditioning.



Skipper Downstairs has recently been remodeled especially with youth groups needs in mind. It has 3 large rooms with 12 beds (6 bunk beds), and 1 medium-sized room with 8 beds (4 bunk beds). The large rooms are great for a group of kids and their counselor or chaperones to share a room for optimal supervision and the medium size room is great for your event administrative staff that does not need to sleep with the kids. We have also added individual air-conditioning and heating units to each sleeping room. There is also a common lounge space with a fireplace and comfy chairs at the end of the hall. Restrooms and showers

are two communal gendered spaces at the end of the hall. Please note that upstairs is the dining room and common space. Any guests may also use these downstairs restrooms. However, we also now have two handicap accessible gender-neutral single stall restrooms on the upper level.

Heritage is also known as “the barn”. It was the original barn for the farm when the property was purchased. It has been remodeled as a very comfortable gathering space and bunk house while retaining some of the original barn structure. It is perfect for small adult or family groups. There is ample space to gather around the fireplace, in comfy chairs and couches, and around the dinner table, or outside on the porch. Heritage has 6 sleeping rooms. Two of them have one queen-size bed as well as a bunk and single bed, sleeping up to 5 and great for a family unit. The other four rooms have 3 single beds and one bunk bed. The total sleeping capacity is currently 28. Heritage also has a nice size home kitchen, so groups may choose to do their own cooking or join us for meals in the dining hall. There is also an open basement multipurpose space which is currently home to our camp “game room” with open hours for everyone on camp. Heritage also has heat and air-conditioning.



The Parker Ridge Cabins are a short walk up the path from Skipper. There you will find 5 cabins named after camp donors: Parker, Wealand, Kropf, Westminster, and West Park. All cabins sleep about 12 in bunk beds, have 2 toilets, 2 showers, 2 sinks, simple heating, and electricity. These cabins are available in late Spring, Summer, and Fall. Parker and Wealand have been remodeled to include synthetic wood laminate floors, a large picture window, a dorm size refrigerator and microwave oven. Each cabin is rented individually making them an affordable and great choice for individuals, families, or smaller groups.

Directors Cabins: The red cabin is the South cabin and is located near Parker Ridge and the other one is the North cabin and is near 6 cabin hill. Both cabins have two toilets, showers and sinks in the cabin, along with about 5 bunk beds and electricity. The South cabin is has a ¾ length wall between the two sides with an open area before the door. The North cabin is two rooms with separate doors to the outside. These cabins are also individually rentable and would be perfect for small groups, families, or individual retreats. No cooking space is currently provided. These cabins are only available in the summer and early fall.



Cabin hill is available during the summer months for those who want to experience more of God’s creation by staying deeper in the woods! There are two sets of cabins, **Hawthorne Hollow and Oak Slopes**. Each cabin has 6 bunk beds sleeping 12 total with electricity. This would be a great space for a summer youth group retreat. Cabins are rented in pairs. There are two bath and shower houses with toilets, showers and sinks located in the center of the cabin area between each pair of cabins.
